## Medicaid Applications for Pregnant Women and Children

- Pregnant women and children may apply for Medicaid at Tri-County Health Department.
- These applications are completed and sent directly to the state Medicaid office for processing. The state Medicaid office believes that this may be faster for those applying only for Medicaid at this time.
- After the state Medicaid office processes the application, the information is sent to the applicant's county Social Services office where a tech is assigned to the case. From this point, the county tech is the applicant's contact person about Medicaid services. If the application is for Emergency Medicaid only, the application is sent to the county instead of to the state Medicaid office.
- During the visit at Tri-County Health Department, a public health nurse provides teaching, counseling, and referral to other programs that are available.

- Call to make an appointment. During this call, information about what documentation to bring to the visit will be provided. This way, only one visit may be needed.
- Documentation of a positive pregnancy test is required. This can be obtained at the time of the appointment at Tri-County if needed.
